ARCHERY CLUB

Archery Club started at Summit maintenance, concentration, Academy in 2005 with the support of two parents - Allen Kirchenbaum and Marcia Benninger. These two dedicated volunteers helped parent establish a solid archery tradition at Summit. Today, Summit has an active Archery Club and also teaches archery as part of its physical education curriculum.

Archery Club is part of the National Archery in the Schools Program (NASP). The club teaches Olympic-style target archery using state-of-the-art compound bows adjusted to fit each individual student. Coaches undergo a 12-hour National Archery Association Level I training program to be certified as Basic Archery Instructors. Archery helps students learn safetv. technique, equipment use and

coordination, goal setting, self-discipline and self-awareness.

During the 2017-18 school year, Archery Club practiced twice a week under the guidance of Middle School teachers Chris Bryant, Monica Nelson and Sue Sabo. Archery Club co-founder Marcia Benninger helped teach archery during after-school club meetings and in-school physical education classes. Gary Barmore, father of student archer Connor Barmore, helped coach Archery Club and also spent many hours repairing bows and arrows!

The Archery Club had an incredible season, and students made great progress. They are looking forward to another fun and successful season during the 2018-19 school year.


REMEMBERING CHRIS BRYANT






